I John - The Letter

The first letter John writes is keyed to his personal witness of the living Jesus, not a spirit of "ghost"

The Heretics' effect on the church was to cause doubt about Jesus' very existence as well as their salvation through Jesus <u>alone</u>.

John closes out his first letter with a final way to be confident in salvation and adds a warning about the Antichrist. (I John 4:1-5:21)

Intro – John highlights the differences between good and evil and a sure-fire way to know the difference.

Love, according to John, is the defining characteristic of the Christian.

In the final chapters, John will explain the third of three ways that a person can be certain that they belong to God.
